For those of you who are new and for those of you aren't and have just forgotten, we have a great website where you can see the latest news, event information and updated class times and topics. You can download the newsletter

and see the “quilt Show” in color. Check us out, you'll like it. In order to download the newsletter and the block of the month, you need to have a current version of Adobe Acrobat Reader which is free for download on the internet.

Fabric Exchange Lottery: How It Works

At each meeting, members may participate in either (or both) fabric exchange or a fabric lottery.

To participate in the fabric exchange, a member places 5 pieces of the designated size of a specified color or type of fabric concealed in an envelope. She may enter one or several envelopes. At the general meeting the member puts her envelopes in the pool and may take an equal number for herself.

To participate in the fabric lottery, the member brings any amount she wishes of fat quarters in the designated type (color or prints). They are placed in a stack.

For each fat quarter, she placed her name in a drawing. The drawing takes place at the break in the general meeting. If there are a lot of fat quarters, then there may be more than one winner. The member(s) whose name is drawn wins the fat quarters.

Fabric Exchange

5 1/2” squares of white, black or red or any combination of the three.

Fabric Lottery

For the fat quarter drawing, anything with hearts.

For the December meeting, there were 15 fat quarters which were won by Joye Gill.

Library Review: Applique: What a Great Connector!

Recently a friend asked me to give her a hand project to help fill the hours of a long hospital stay. I wanted to find something with warmth and love and heart in it, so I picked up **“Friends Forever Quilting Together”** by *Nancy Smith and Lynda Milligan*. I found a darling flower appliqué pattern, a very easy bread basket cover. I pawed through my stash, found a packet of fat quarters, copied the pattern off the page, and took the whole pile to her to see if she liked it. Yes, she did. I did too, so we’re both going to make one. It was magic to find something we both liked that we could do together. She’s a very special friend. I think that’s the real draw of quilting. The things we make have connecting power, often in mysterious ways.

At the same time that I was rummaging through the book bin for my friend I found several other appliqué books I love, and all of them are powerful connectors. **“Replique Quilts-- Appliqué Designs from Favorite Photos,”** by *Chris Lynn Kirsch*, is a great one. How lovely to take a photo of a beloved family home and make a wallhanging of it for a grandchild or an aunt, or a picture of a favorite pet for a child. This book takes simple examples and leads the quilter through more and more steps until she’s ready for the most intricate designs. The warmth of fabric and colors and the love

of the subject can become a treasure like nothing else.

Another favorite appliqué book is **“Whimsies and Whynots, A Playful Approach to Quilting”** by Spokane’s own *Mary Lou Weidman*. It’s not a technical how-to book. It’s a release-your-expectations-and-fears-and-start-exploring book. Using her examples rockets us into the closet of dream stuff and memories. I love the one on page 32, titled *“Too Hot.”* It shows a young couple parked on a hill overlooking a moonlit valley. Hm. Maybe we’ll move on!

Whatever your favorite image may be, a lapful of fabric and a needle and thread can lift it into the realm of beauty and memories, tying us together across town or across the world, and certainly down through the generations. The library has these and other appliqué books. Come take a look. -Susie Schmidt, Librarian

2008 Mystery Quilted Wall Hanging February Block of the Month:

Tomato Pincushion

This year's blocks will make a cute row quilt wallhanging for your sewing room. Or, you could use the blocks on kitchen towels, potholders, gifts or sewing room items. You need just three fabrics to create this month's tomato pincushion. All of the patterns this year will have a mandatory white or white on white fabric background for continuity in the block exchange. Block will square up to 6 1/2". You will need four of these blocks for your row quilt, plus some for the exchange.

For each block you will need:

White background fabric:

One 2" x 7" strip for the top of the block

One 1" x 7" strip for the bottom of the block

Two 1 1/2" x 5" strips for the sides

Four 1 1/2" x 1 1/2" squares for the corners of the tomato

Red fabric:

One 5" square for the tomato pincushion

Green fabric:

Two 2" squares for the leaves

Place a 1 1/2" white square on each corner of the red square, right sides together. Stitch diagonally across each white square and press toward the corner to create your tomato shape. Do not trim the white squares. Sew on the white side strips. Sew the bottom white strip on.

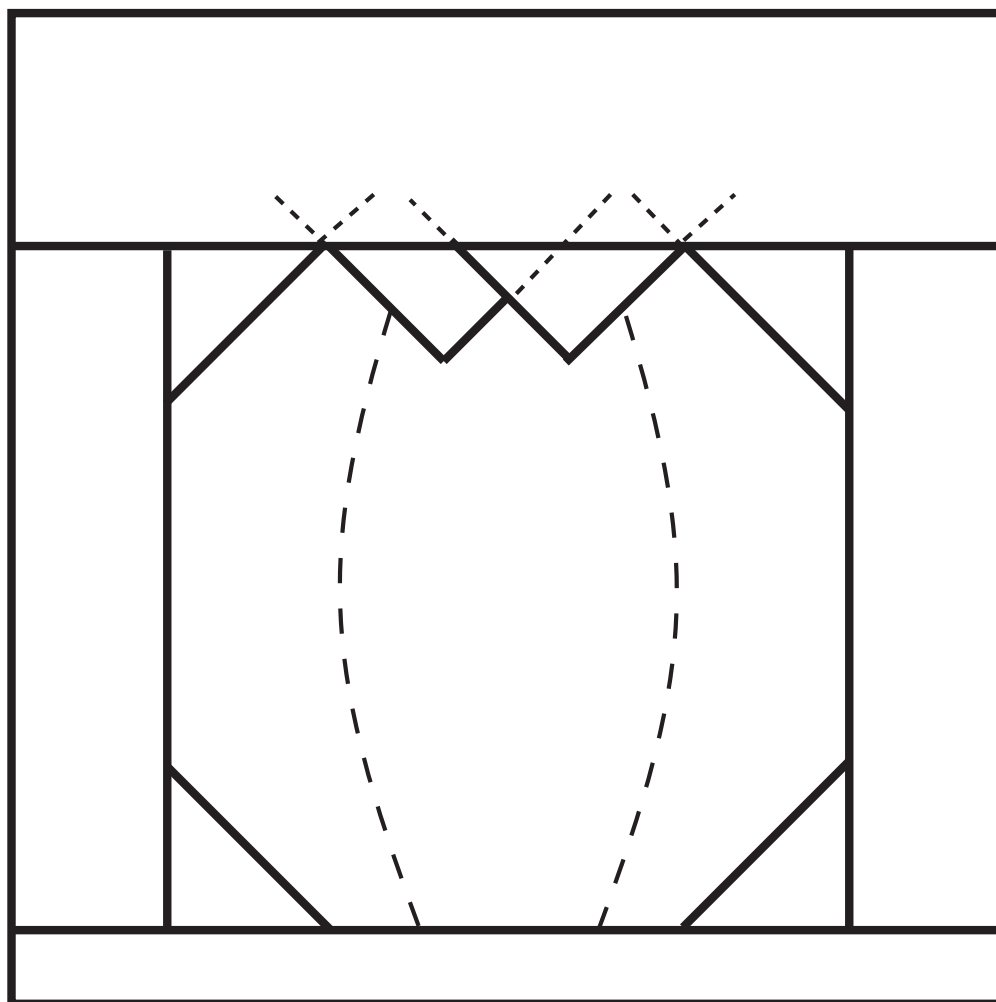
Fold the green squares in half diagonally, press, fold in half diagonally again and press. These are "prairie points" and will become the "leaves" of your pincushion. Position the prairie point leaves with all raw edges together and green triangle edges 1/4" over the top red tomato edges, and baste in place. You can position these at different heights, or use just one leaf—whatever you choose. Add the top white strip, enclosing the prairie points and your block is almost complete.

Trim the white strip on the bottom of your block to 1/2". Square the block to 6 1/2".

You could satin stitch "pins" in your pincushion, but I think I'll use real pins—it will be faster and add three dimensions. You can add vertical lines in your tomato now or when you machine or hand quilt it.

For each block you turn in, your name goes into a drawing to win a row of blocks. Enter as many blocks as you wish. When you make an item with your won blocks, you get a bottle of "Sew-Da," bottled right here in the Spokane Valley --just for us! It's full of yummy fiber!

We are going to have a contest for the most raffle tickets sold!!! What can you do? I know what I can do. See you in February to help me out!!!!!!

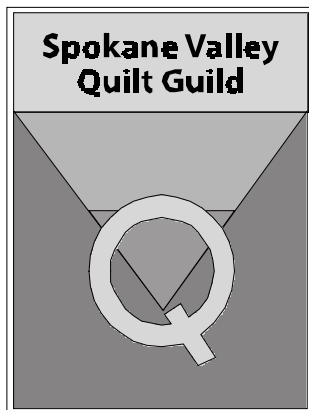
